Anti-Bullying Focus

Since the Power of One Anti-Bullying show last week, we have been focusing on identifying bullying behaviour and the difference that the person who is a bystander can make. The show talked about the bystander becoming an 'upstander' and either sticking up for the victim (verbally) or seeking help from an adult. We are also encouraging children to speak up and tell someone, preferably a teacher, if they feel that they have been a victim of bullying or made feel bad about themself. We stress that this is NOT 'dobbing' on someone, but actually helping this behaviour to stop. Sometimes this is hard for students, and they will tell someone they trust at home. We ask parents and carers to please let us know if this is the case, so that we can look into it.

Change to Semester One Report format

In response to concerns that we may not be giving parents and carers the information they want to know about their child/ren's progress at school in a way that is easy to read and make sense, we surveyed a group of parents to see how they felt. Responses varied, but generally it was felt that most attention is paid to the grades in effort and achievement and the general comment. As a result of this, the teachers have been looking at reports from other schools and decided to trial a revised format for 2018. The report still looks very much the same and each key learning area will still have a grade for achievement and effort for years one to 6, and will be broken up into statements or descriptions of specific skills and strategies that each stage has been working on. Teachers will place ticks to indicate whether your child has achieved this at expected grade level, is working towards achieving it or is working above this level of expectation. We welcome any feedback you have after you receive your child's report in the last week of term. Kindergarten reports will be slightly different according to the Department of Education guidelines. We previewed the format at the P & C meeting on Wednesday and received a positive response from those in attendance.


GOLD CHANCE CARD WINNER
